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Prominent Musician's Death.

The death of Mr C. W. Wilson, which occurred at the end of last week in Dublin, will be regretted by a large circle of friends in the metropolis, where he occupied for many years a prominent position among musicians. The son of the late Mr Charles Monck Wilson, of Caherconlish, Co. Limerick, he was educated at St. Columba's College, Rathfarnham, subsequently studying music with Commendatore Esposito in the Royal Irish Academy of Music. A close friendship sprang up between master and pupil, which lasted throughout life. When the Dublin Orchestral Society was founded in 1898, under the conductorship of Signor Esposito, Mr Wilson was made secretary, and he continued to act in that capacity till the activities of the Society terminated.

For many years, from 1904, Mr Wilson was Registrar of the Feis Ceoil Association. He held successive positions as organist in several churches, the last being the Unitarian Church in Stephen's Green. Under a quiet and reserved manner he had a veritable passion for music, and his knowledge of the subject was profound, while his critical judgment of music and artists was seldom at fault. In recent years he suffered from ill-health, and some years ago he resigned his appointments and went to live in London. He came over this summer to visit Dublin, and his friends were rejoiced at the apparent improvement in his health. It was deceptive, however, and he was obliged to go into a nursing home, where he died after a short illness, his wife and daughters being with him.
