## DEATH OF MR J. J. TREHY.

The death took place at his residence, 23 Glentworth street, late last night, of Mr James J. Trehy, at the age of 65 years. The deceased was a well-known and popular citizen, and his demise will be learned with keen regret by a wide circle of friends. He was for a number of years managing clerk to the firm of Messrs J. Ryan and Sons, building contractors, Thomas street, and on relinquishing that position he went into the cinema business. He was proprietor of the Abbey Kinema, George's Quay, and when that building was accidentally destroyed by fire early this year he was appointed manager of the Lyric Theatre, a position which he resigned through ill-health recently. The late Mr Trehy was an amateur violinist of considerable repute, and in his early days took a prominent part in athletics and cycling. The remains will be removed to St. Michael's Church at 9 o'clock this evening, and the funeral will leave for Mount St. Laurence Cemetery after Requiem Mass on Monday at 10.30 o'clock.
