DEATH OF REV. J. A. KNOWLES, O.S.A

Numerous friends in Limerick, where he ministered up to some twenty years ago, have learned with regret of the death of the Rev Joseph A. Knowles, O.S.A., which occurred in a private nursing home in Dublin last Tuesday. He was very highly respected and esteemed by all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance. Born in Dublin in 1861, the late Father Knowles studied at Orfagh College, Rathfarnham, and ordained at Rome in 1882. He attached to St. Monica's Priory, Hoxton Square, London, and spent some years in the Irish Augustinian missions, Australia, and in various, houses of the Order in Ireland. lie had been for some years in declining health. Only on Saturday last he attended the funeral of his sister, the late Mrs Nash, Charleville, Rathmines.
