

THE CORPORATION AT ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL.

On Sunday, the Feast of the Kingship of Christ was observed in St. John's Cathedral in a befitting ceremonial, and at which the Mayor and Corporation, with the municipal officials, attended, on the invitation of the Bishop, Most Rev. Dr. Keane. At 12 o'clock Solemn High Mass was sung, the Bishop presiding at the ceremonies, which were attended by a crowded congregation. Fr. Kelly, C.C., was celebrant of the Mass; Rev. Fr. Carroll, C.C., St. John's, assistant; Rev. Fr. Rice, C.C., do, sub-celebrant; and Rev. Fr. Brassill, C.C., do, master of ceremonies. The assistant priests on the throne were Rev. Father McNamara, Administrator, Rev. Father Colbert and Rev. Father Dolan. After the First Gospel, Father Rice preached a sermon appropriate to the Feast, and at the close of the Mass his lordship received the Mayor and members of the Borough Council and officials in the sacristy. He thanked them for acceding to his invitation to the Cathedral, and invited them to meet the Venerable Apostolic, his Excellency the Most Rev. Dr. Robinson, at the private reception at the Cathedral at 2.30 o'clock on the 15th November.

The Mayor, on behalf of the Council thanked himself, said he was very grateful to his lordship for his very kind invitation, which they would be very pleased to accept.

CO. LIMERICK LADY'S ESTATE

Late Mrs. A. D. R. Hunt's Bequests

To Church and S.P.C.A.

Mrs Annie Dunscombe Russell Hunt, of Friarstown House, Limerick, widow of Mr John Thomas Urquhart Hunt, J.P., who died on June 10th last, left unsettled personal property in England and the Irish Free State valued at £139,623 7s 4d. Probate of her will, dated 5th December, 1929, has been granted to Arthur Blood-Smyth, of 47 O'Connell-street, Limerick, solicitor, and Robert Hodder Twigg, of Limerick, bank sub-agent. The testatrix left her estate and interest in the house and lands of Friarstown and Traverstown, Limerick, with the stock, furniture, etc., to her grand-nephew-in-law, Vere John Urquhart Hunt, son of Frederick J. R. Hunt, lately Chief Justice of Travancore, India, desiring him within six months of her death to take the name of Wilkinson in addition to that of Hunt, so that he might be known as Vere John Urquhart Wilkinson Hunt, and also left to him £20,000. She left—

One year's wages (free of duty) to each labourer and domestic servant of one year's service, and, in addition, £200 to her herd, John McNamara.

£50 each to William Greensmith and Michael Kirby;

£5,000 to the Limerick Branch of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, the income to be used for the care and protection of all animals, including dogs and cats, in the City and County of Limerick.

£3,000 to the Representative Body of the Church of Ireland, the income to be applied for the benefit of the Rector of the Parish of Kilpeacon, Co. Limerick;

£1,000 to the Representative Body of the Church of Ireland, the income to be applied for the upkeep of the Wilkinson vault in Abbington Churchyard and the balance for the benefit of the rector of the said parish as the Diocesan Council of Cashel thinks fit;

£500 to Arthur Blood-Smyth, £5,000 to Robert Hodder Twigg, sub-agent of the Bank of Ireland, if acting as executor, and the residue of the property to her nephew, Henry Grant Wilkinson, of Albert street, Aberdeen.

She stated—"I wish to be buried with my father, Henry Pardon Wilkinson, in the Wilkinson vault in Abbington Churchyard, and I request that my funeral be private, and no flowers. Having an objection to hasty interments, I wish not to be buried or the lid of the shell of my coffin screwed down until at least four days after my supposed death, and I desire a doctor to see that I am really dead."
