DEATH OF REV. T. COLBERT.

We regret to announce the death which
took place at St. Munchin's Diocesan College,
Henry street, yesterday morning of the Rev.
Thomas P. Colbert, after a few days' illness.
Father Colbert, who was born in 1883, had
only been ailing since Sunday, and his early
demise has been learned with deep regret in
the city and throughout the diocese.

He was son of an old and highly esteemed
citizen, Mr Thomas Colbert, ex-Superin-
tendent of Telegraphs in the General Post
Office, with whom and his relatives deep
sympathy is expressed. The rev. gentleman
was educated in St. Munchin's College,
where he had a brilliant career before pro-
ceeding to Maynooth, where he was ordained
in 1908. After ministering two years in
Liverpool, Father Colbert returned to St.
Munchin's College, where he was on the
Professorial staff ever since. He was also
chaplain to the Training College, South
Circular Road, and was very highly res-
pected and esteemed. The Bishop, Most
Rev Dr Keane, called at the College yester-
day and expressed his condolence with the
Very Rev Fr. Wall, President, and the pro-
fessorial staff on the loss of a valued
colleague and friend.

The remains were removed to St. Michael's
parochial church last evening, and the inter-
ment will be in Mount St. Lawrence on
Monday, after Office and Requiem High
Mass, at 11 o'clock.
