WATER SUPPLY INCREASE.

The Water Committee last night decided
to advertise for tenders for laying an addi-
tional pipe line to increase the city water
supply, and for the installation at Clareville
works of a system of mechanical filters, as
recommended by Professor Purcell, consult-
ing engineer. For the purpose the Corpora-
tion has borrowed a loan of £20,000 on
long term credit, and when the contract is
carried through the pressure, at the high
level will be considerably increased and a
purer supply of water available.

FUNERAL OF MRS M. J. LYONS, CROOM.

The remains of the late Mrs M. J. Lyons,
