## MANCHESTER TRAGIC ACCIDENT.

### Inquest on Two Natives of Limerick.

A verdict of accidental death was returned at an inquest at Patricroft, Lancs., on Tuesday, on two brothers, John O'Connor (50) and Frank O'Connor (45), who were killed on the main Manchester-Liverpool road, near Manchester air port.

John Cullen (40), of Lancefield-street, Paddington, London, who is in Eccles and Patricroft Hospital with a fractured leg, in a statement read by the Coroner, said he met the brothers O'Connor, who were natives of Limerick, and they left London a month ago to travel the country.

Bertie Nichols (35), of Cross Flats Drive, Leeds, said he was driving a motor van from Liverpool to Leeds at night, when he saw something which caused him to pull up. He swerved and stopped, and then found he had knocked down and badly injured three men.
