CARD PARTY'S ALARMING EXPERIENCE.

Help-up by Armed Men.

Six men and a young woman had an alarming experience on Sunday night when returning from a card party at Renville (Oranmore).

When nearing their homes they were called on to halt by a number of men, some of whom were armed, and, it is alleged, shots were fired over their heads.

Some of the members of the card party ran away, and shots were fired after them. The three who remained (Miss Delia Burke, a youth named Frank Burke, and an ex-R.I.C. man named Reilly) were placed against a wall, and, it is stated, further shots were fired over their heads. Reilly and the girl were then sent away, and Burke was questioned by the leader of the men, none of whom was disguised, and then allowed to go.

Early yesterday morning four men in the district were arrested by Supt. Hunt and brought to Galway.
