Points from the speeches of the various members of the Council follow:—

Great Britain (Mr Henderson)—Prevention of war must be secured. An effective scheme of armament reduction is an essential to the future welfare of the peoples.

Irish Free State (Mr McGilligan)—At last, after ten years, we seem to be at the beginning of our real task.

Germany (Herr Curtius)—The road is now open, at least for holding the Disarmament Conference.

France (M. Briand)—We have now reached a point when we may expect the Conference to be a success.

Japan (M. Yoshizama)—The Commission's work is as effective as could have been hoped for.

THREE-YEAR-OLD SMOKES CIGARS.

A three-year-old Negro boy, who smokes cigars and cigarettes, has been discovered by health authorities at Fort Scott (Kansas). The child's habit came to the attention of Dr Brown, the Secretary of the State Board of Health. The mother disclosed that the boy had been smoking ever since he had been able to walk. She said that on the morning of the doctor's visit the child, who recently recovered from typhoid fever, had "fussed around" until his father gave him a cigar.

Flight-Sergeant Wren and Corpl. Jeffrey were killed when an aeroplane crashed following a collision with a large eagle at Risalpur.

During the recent coal stoppage shipments from South Wales ports were reduced by 1,200,000 tons, compared with those for the corresponding period last year.
