DISTRESSING CITY TRAGEDY.

Inquest and Verdict.

An inquest was held at Barrington's Hospital yesterday by Mr J. S. McNeice, City Coroner, and a jury into the circumstances connected with the death of Patrick O'Dwyer, plumber, No. 4 O'Curry Place, in the institution on Sunday night.

Inspector McCarron conducted the enquiry.

Bridget O'Dwyer, wife of the deceased, stated that her husband was 46 years of age, and had been suffering from rheumatism during the past two years, which prevented him working. He returned home on Sunday at 5 o'clock, and went to his room. She was temporarily absent from the house for a time, and on returning she went into his room, and asked him how he felt, and he replied that he would be alright only for the pain in his leg. Sometime later she went into the room again and saw him lying on the bed evidently in distress. She summoned her brother, who lived in the house with her, and when he arrived he had the Civic Guards summoned.

Dr J. Roberts stated that death was due to shock and hæmorrhage, due to an incised wound in the throat.

Patrick Kirby, brother-in-law of the deceased, who identified the body, stated when he entered his bedroom he found him lying on the bed. There was a wound in the throat from which blood was flowing, but he found no instrument that would be likely to cause the injury. He sent for the Civic Guards, and had the ambulance requisitioned. He was aware that deceased had been in ill-health during the past two years.

The evidence of Sergeant O'Mahony, O'Curry street station, was to the effect that when he arrived at the deceased's house he entered his room and found O'Dwyer lying on the bed. There was an extensive wound in the throat, and blood on the bed clothing. He found a blood stained razor a short distance from the body. The man was then alive, but breathing heavily, and he was removed to Barrington's Hospital where he died sometime after ten o'clock.

The jury returned a verdict of suicide whilst temporarily insane.

PROPOSED SALMON HATCHERY.

From what can be gathered there is to be every prospect of a salmon hatchery being established in the Shannon. The Minister of Fisheries. When a deputation from the Fishery Board of Cornwall waited on the Ministers of Fisheries and Industry of Commerce recently, it pressed on them the urgent necessity of a hatchery to make good the losses on the natural spawning beds by the operations of the Shannon power development. It was pointed out that the river was so low as this winter, and that the spawning beds on the tributaries were virtually destroyed with the result that grave injury was done to the fry by the gulls.

The capital cost of the hatchery is estimated at £5,000 exclusive of maintenance, which would be a rather heavy item, but that the outlay would be justified in retaining an important national industry. The Ministers received the view of the deputation very sympathetically and developments may be expected shortly.
