COUNTY LIMERICK FARMER'S FATAL FALL.

William Ryan, a farmer, aged 72 years,
 living at Castle Erkin, Caherconlish, was
 fatally injured while engaged in fixing a hay
 rick on his land a few days ago. He was,
 apparently, standing on the rick fastening a
 rope, when the latter got entangled in his
 legs, and he fell head foremost, fracturing
 his neck.

An inquest was held by Dr W. R. Cleary,
 Coroner, Hospital, and a jury, when the
 circumstances attending death were given
 by some witnesses, the medical testimony
 being that death was due to fracture of the
 neck.

The jury returned a verdict of accidental
 death, and expressed sympathy with the
 relatives of the deceased.
