New York, Sunday.—Two persons were killed and more than twenty have been taken to hospital injured as the result of storms and floods in Brooklyn, where much damage to property has been done. deaths were caused by a motor car collision in the blinding gale; while the injuries were due to falling street signs and chimneys and to broken windows.
