**DEATH OF MR. P. A. O'BRIEN,  
B.C.**

The death, which we announce with regret, occurred at his residence, Newenham street, this morning of Mr Paul A. O'Brien, B.C., P.C. The sad news has been learned with sincere sorrow, not alone in his native city, but throughout the province, where he was well known in commercial and business circles. About twelve days ago he contracted a cold, which developed into influenza, and then pneumonia supervened. During the past couple of days his condition became critical, and, despite the best medical and nursing skill, he passed away, as stated, this morning.

Mr O'Brien was a deservedly popular citizen, courteous and affable in all his dealings. He was district manager of the Texaco Petroleum Company, for whom he had built up a large business connection in the city and throughout Munster, where he was well known and highly respected. He was elected a member of the Corporation in 1920, and continued to hold his seat in the City Council up to his untimely death.

He was Mayor of the city two years, in 1925-'26 and 1926-'27, when he did not seek re-election. During his Mayoralty, Mr O'Brien discharged the duties with impartiality and dignity, and in the best interests of the city.

He was Chairman of the local Central Branch of the Cumann na nGaedheal, and his last official act in that capacity was to receive the Minister of Industry and Commerce recently, and to preside at a public meeting held in the Town Hall. His demise at the age of 53 years is a heavy blow to his widow and young family, with whom deep sympathy will be felt in their irreparable loss.
