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HOSPITAL SWEEPSTAKE APPEAL.

Dismissed in London.

London, Monday.

An appeal from a decision concerning the legality of the sale in Great Britain of tickets in the Irish Hospitals Sweepstake came before Lords Justices Scrutton, Greer and Slessor, in the Court of Appeal to-day.

Mr John More appealed from the judgment of a divisional court discharging with costs a rule nisi calling on the Registrar of Companies to show cause why a writ should not issue directing him to register, pursuant to the Companies Act, the articles and memorandum of association of a company called the Irish Hospitals (Sweep), Limited formed to sell in Britain tickets for the Irish Hospitals Sweepstake.

The appeal involved the point whether it was legal in Britain to sell tickets in a lottery which was lawfully conducted in the Irish Free State by the authority of the State Government.

The appeal was dismissed.

The death took place at St. Patrick's, Esker, Athenry, on Saturday night of the Rev. Vincent Bourke, a distinguished Redemptorist clergyman.
