#### Weekly Dairy Market.

Tuesday, April 21st—Seasonable numbers, entry a fair average class, good attendance; business followed the routine of last week, with an indication of more life, as the useful heifers found a readier exchange; enquiry for nice promising lots, not "topper," but the short-legged, shapely heifer, ranging from £22 10s—£25. This class, with colour and quality, were bid for and bought freely; the supply not up to the demand, with the result that some customers were not able to fill up requirements. The prospect of the price of milk has had its effect upon the price of heifers, as buyers require concession in values, and hold out for a reduction in rates. Demand for dairy cows of the right stamp, old cows hard to place. Over the days proceedings there was good all round selling trade, with a satisfactory clearance. Promising, £23 10s—£27 10s; ordinary, £17 15s.

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
