### OSECUTION AT SAD HURLING FATALITY CO. LIMERICK.

### Struck by a Ball.

At Broadford, County Li merick, on Sunday afternoon, as a result of an accident, a man named John Horan, aged 36 years, a native of Templeglantine, was fatally injured.

A hurling contest between Moneygay and Templeglantine was timed to start about 3.30, and when the teams had taken the field there was the usual puck about of the ball by individual players of both teams. One of the Templeglantine players, named Rennix, net a drop puck out with his hurley, and Horan, who was standing about 20 yards away, failed to see the ball coming. and got struck behind the right ear. He collapsed, and became unconscious.

The Sergeant of the Dromcollogher Guards who was present, tried artificial respiration without result. A priest and doctor were then summoned, and the ambulance from Croom sent for, but the unfortunate man died shortly after.
