**DISTINGUISHED
 LITTERATEUR DEAD.**

Born in Limerick.

Mr Frank Frankfort Moore, whose novels have for many years delighted a wide circle of faithful readers, died on Monday at St. Leonards four days before his seventy-sixth birthday, says "The Times."

Born at Limerick, he was educated at the Royal Academical Institution, Belfast, and was for a time a private tutor. He travelled in South and East Africa, India, the West Indies, and South America, and worked as a journalist from 1876 to 1892. Meanwhile he had published two volumes of verse, and begun his long succession of stories, romantic and historical. Perhaps the best known are "I Forbid the Banns," "A Grey Eye or So," and "The King's Messenger." Mr Moore was an Ulster Loyalist.

During his period of journalism in Belfast he was leader-writer, musical and dramatic critic, on the staff of the "Belfast News-Letter." Among his school-fellows at the Royal Academical Institution, Belfast, was the late Mr S. K. Cowan, a well-known verse writer and cricketer.

Mr Moore was twice married—first to Grace, daughter of the late Colonel Balcombe, of Clontarf (she died in 1901), and, secondly, to Dorothea, daughter of the Rev W. J. Hatton, of Knowle House, Wellington, by whom he had three daughters.
