At a special meeting of the Council of the Cork Chamber of Commerce, Mr M. ### ELDERLY WOMAN'S FATAL FALL.

Dr. M. R. Clery, County Coroner, and a jury, held an inquest at the City Home and Hospital on Thursday evening into the circumstances connected with the death in the institution of an elderly woman named Mary McSweeney, a resident of Rathbane.

Sergeant Considine, Mary street, conducted the enquiry, and the evidence showed that on last Sunday the deceased, who was seventy years of age, was a visitor to the institution to see her sister, who was ill. In coming down stairs she accidentally missed her footing and fell, sustaining injuries to which she succumbed.

The jury recorded a verdict of death from injuries accidentally sustained, and exonerated the institution officials from all blame.
