COUNTY COUNCIL.

A half-yearly meeting of the County
Council is convened for Saturday next at
11 o'clock. The agenda consists of con-

with the Bank overdraft, in addition to a
resolution from the Limerick Corporation on

three men for political offences. The notices
of motion deal with loans under the Housing
Act, the grant for relief of local rates, and
the necessity for a loan of £3,800 to build
a Technical School at Newcastle West.
