Council has convened a conference to be
held in the Town Hall, Limerick, next
Tuesday evening at 7.30, to consider in all
its bearings the present position of the
bacon industry in the Free State, and the
effect of foreign competition. The following
bodies will be invited to send delegates—
Limerick County Council, County Commit-
tee of Agriculture, Corporation, Chamber of
Commerce, the Limerick Bacon Curers, the
Limerick Pig Buyers, the West Limerick
Executive of the Farmers' Union, and the
seven Deputies of the City and County.

TARIFF ON BACON IMPORTS.

Dublin County Committee of Agriculture,
at a meeting on Tuesday, discussed the
question of a tariff on bacon, arising out of
the receipt of a resolution from the Limerick
Committee upon that subject.

Mr Blake proposed and Mr Dowling
seconded the adoption of a resolution in
favour of a tariff on imported bacon.
