

in a report which he presented to the Health Committee of the Corporation at its meeting this week. He referred to accumulations in back yards and lanes, and observed that the manner in which refuse is dumped at Corkanree constitutes a menace. It is, however, satisfactory to realise that this will disappear when the dock extension works are begun, as it is hoped they soon will be. Dr. Moran observes that the system of city scavenging is defective and uneconomic, and he suggests that a modern sweeper should be purchased to deal with the main streets, so that lanes and alleys might receive more attention from the manual sweepers. His report is a very important one in the interests of the public health, and one of the first duties of the new Corporation should be to give practical effect to it.

DEATH OF MR. T. A. HARTIGAN, CREAN HOUSE.

The death of Mr Timothy A. Hartigan, Crean House, Bruff, which occurred on Wednesday evening, removes from the county a gentleman who had a long association with racing. He had reached a fairly advanced age, and farmed extensively. He was son of the late Mr Martin Hartigan, and cousin of Mr J. P. Hartigan, the well-known Irish racing official, and of Mr Thomas A. Hartigan, Secretary, County Agricultural and Vocational Education Committees. The deceased bred and raced that good horse Knockouna, and had an interest in Kirkland before he was sold, to win a Grand National some years before the war.

The interment took place, after Requiem Mass, in the family burial place yesterday, at Meanus. The cortege was of large proportions, and testified to the respect in which the deceased was held in the county.
