## RICITY WORKERS' CLAIM.

At a special court yesterday,   
Lyons, living at Farranshone, was charged  
by Sergeant O'Mahony with the embezzle-

## THREE MEN GASSED.

Three men, employes of the Corporation  
Gas Concern, were gassed on Tuesday
