## SUDDEN DEATH.

Martin Hogarty, aged 45, married, em-  
ployed on the permanent way staff of the  
Great Southern Railways, was found dead in  
bed at his lodging in Upper Gerald Griffin  
street yesterday morning. The discovery  
was made by one of the household, who  
informed the Civic Guards at William  
Street Station, who communicated with  
the Coroner. The deceased, who was a  
native of Ballinasloe, was out on Tuesday  
apparently in his usual health, and did not  
complain before retiring to rest that night.

## The Inquest.

Mr J. S. McNeice, solr., Deputy Coroner,  
with a jury, held an inquest at Barrington's  
Hospital last night.

Inspector Ryan conducted the inquiry,  
and evidence of identification was given by  
Norah Hogarty, Ballinasloe, widow, who  
stated that her husband was a plate layer  
in the employment of the Great Southern  
Railways Co.

The medical evidence given by Dr J. G.  
Holmes and Dr T. Morris, House Surgeon,  
Barrington's Hospital, who made a post-  
mortem, was that death was due to heart  
failure, associated with a persistent thymus  
gland.

The jury returned a verdict of death in  
accordance with the medical testimony, and  
tendered sympathy with the widow.
