SUDDEN DEATH.

The medical evidence given by Dr J. G. Holmes and 'Dr T. Morris, House Surgeon. Barrington's Hospital, who made a postmortem, was that death was due to heart failure, associated with a persistent thymus

gland.

The jury returned a vertical of death in accordance with the medical testimony, and tendered sympathy with the widow.
