FUNERAL OF ARCHDEACON LEE.

The obsequies of the late Ven. Archdeacon Lee, P.P., V.F., took place yesterday at Newcastle West Church, amidst every feeling of deep sympathy and regret. All business was suspended in the town, and the church, which was heavily draped in mourning, was crowded by the parishioners, and many from the late Archdeacon's former parish, Abbeyfeale, and from all parts of the diocese.

Over 100 priests attended, including Right Rev. Monsignor Broderick, Vicar-Apostolic of Western Nigeria.

The Most Rev. Dr. Keane, Bishop of Limerick, presided at the Office and Solemn Requiem Mass.
