**DEATH OF MR GEORGE G.  
GUBBINS.**

The death, which we announce with regret, took place rather suddenly at Liverpool this morning, of Mr George Gough Gubbins, in his seventy-fifth year. The deceased gentleman was son of the late Mr W. J. Gubbins, Castle Connell, and brother of Lady Shaw, Glenalevan, Ennis Road, and Mr Blakeney Gubbins. He had been in failing health for some considerable time past, and last May was on a visit to Lady Shaw. He left Limerick in early life, and was at the time of his death home on a holiday from Valparaiso, South America, where he was representative for many years of the well known firm of Messrs Graham Rowe & Co., general merchants, Liverpool. The deceased gentleman leaves a wife and family to mourn his loss, and with them and Lady Shaw and the other members of the family sincere sympathy will be extended in their bereavement.

**MUNICIPAL HOUSING  
SCHEME.**

Particulars of the foreshadowed municipal housing scheme have not yet been furnished by the special committee appointed by the Corporation, on the suggestion of Councillor C. V. O'Malley. The proposal is to build five hundred houses on a loan, to be raised with the sanction of the Local Government Department, at a probable cost of £150,000, in order to relieve the congestion in the slums and other crowded areas.

In view of the fact that the Government contemplate introducing a Housing Bill in the Dail very soon, it is important that the Corporation should have their scheme prepared. This Bill, it is stated, will be liberally financed, and the repayment of principal and interest on the loan spread over a long period. The shortage of work-
