DEATH OF MR GEORGE G. GUBBINS.

MUNICIPAL HÖUSING SCHEME.

Particulars of the foreshadowed municipal housing scheme have not yet been furnished by the special committee appointed by the Corporation, on the suggestion of Councillor C. V. O'Malley. The proposal is to build five hundred houses on a loan, to be raised with the sanction of the Local Government Department, at a probable cost of £150,000, in order to relieve the congestion in the slums and other crowded areas.

In view of the fact that the Government contemplate actroducing a Housing Bill in the Dail very soon, it is important that the Corporation should have their scheme prepared.
