President Cosgrave has declined to receive a deputation from Wexford County Council in regard to the Council's proposals for the reduction of State expenditure and the provision of relief for agriculture.

The letter to the Council from the President's Department stated that the recommendations covered too wide a field. The President was prepared, however, to receive memoranda setting forth the views of the Council on the subjects referred to for consideration by the Departments of State concerned.

On the proposition of Mr J. Hall, seconded by Colonel Quin, it was decided that, owing to the refusal of the President to receive a deputation, no further action be taken.
