

## THE CITY HEALTH BOARD.

The principal business to come before the meeting of the Borough Council next Thursday night is a motion handed in by Alderman J. Reidy on the 3rd September last dealing with the administration of the affairs of the County Borough Board of Health. The motion is to transfer the powers, duties, and functions of the Board to a person to be appointed by the Minister for Local Government and Public Assistance. Alderman Reidy's main purpose is to have a Commissioner appointed until the scheme of reorganisation initiated by the late Commissioner, Mr J. P. Geraghty, is completed. The motion is certain to meet with strong opposition, and a close vote is therefore anticipated.
