Waritza is a brown mare by Happy Waror out of Czaritza, by Sir Eager (son of endal and Semolina) out of Princose ueen, by Primrose League, out of May ueen, by Victor. Bachelor's Double is a randson of Kendal, and thus North Drift irries two strains of Kendal, who was bred t Eaton in the same year as Ormonde and as by Bend Or out of Windermere.

In the female line Waritza traces to an wn sister of Chanticleer by Bird Catcher ut of Whim, an ancestress of Solon and

Barcaldine.

Lord Hillingdon in 1929 paid 2,100gns. or North Drift's half sister, Brindadella, by ainsborough. She is a winner of a small ace in Ireland and comes up for sale next hursday at Newmarket.

ver a mile.
