Wednesday, December 16th—Christmas market; cattle—seasonable numbers formed a useful entry, mainly beef and strong cattle; a larger show of beef than usual; well done cattle repeated recent rates, and found ready buyers, steady enquiry; young cows held their own, sufficient demand to absorb good cattle, half meated stock dull, plain sorts difficult to negotiate. Business wore a busy aspect, with a fair good "swing"; all round a steady sale for the right class at current rates. The strong heavy bullocks hard to place; a large and representative attendance; good sell up. Two-and-a-half old heifers, £16—£19 10s; second run, £12—£15 5s; 2½-year-old bullocks, £12 15s—£15; cows, £12 10s—£16 15s; second run, £9 5s—£12; 1½-year-old heifers, £9—£10.
