DEATH OF CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE ROCHE.

Circuit Court Judge Bernard Roche died at his residence, Upper Leeson street, Dublin, this morning. He was a son of Mr Edmund Roche, Naglass, Gortatlea, Co. Kerry. He was one of the members of the Junior Bar, and was promoted to the Bench in 1928, being appointed to the Dublin area. He was a very popular member of the Irish Judicature, and his death will evoke a widespread sentiment of regret in the South of Ireland. The late Mr Roche had been in delicate health for some months past.

The death took place on Saturday at a private nursing home in Dublin of Lieut. Col. John William McNamara, I.M.S., of Crofin, County Clare. His demise is deeply regretted in the district, where he was highly respected and esteemed.
