**DEATH OF MR M. J. O'MAHONY,  
 NEWCASTLE WEST.**

The death, at the early age of 30 years, of  
 Mr Michael John O'Mahony, B.Sc.Ag.,  
 A.R.C.S., eldest son of Mr Patk. O'Mahony,  
 Town Clerk, Newcastle West, has evoked  
 feelings of the deepest regret in Newcastle  
 West. He had a brilliant student career,  
 being a graduate of Cork University, and  
 was employed for a number of years as  
 Agricultural Instructor by the County Cork  
 Committee of Agriculture and Technical  
 Instruction, being stationed at Kanturk. He  
 leaves a widow and young child to mourn  
 his loss. He was a fine type of young Irish-  
 man, and was prominently associated with  
 the G.A.A. from boyhood, being one of the  
 best hurlers in the Newcastle West team in  
 its hey day. He was very popular with all  
 classes, not only in his native town and  
 district, but also in North Cork, where his  
 services and ability were highly appreciated  
 by those with whom his professional work  
 brought him into contact. The deepest  
 sympathy is extended to his bereaved young  
 widow and child, and to his parents and  
 brothers and sisters on their very poignant  
 loss.—COR.

**DEATH OF MR. W. MACDONAGH.**

The death took place this morning in the  
 City Home and Hospital, at an advanced  
 age, of Mr William MacDonagh, Mount  
 Pleasant Avenue. The deceased was the  
 oldest member of the Typographical Associa-  
 tion in the city, and retired from active  
 participation in his craft some years ago.  
 He was a skilled compositor, and a man of
