RECENT BALLINACURRA FATAL ACCIDENT.

At the Liberties Court on Wed., before
Mr J. M. Flood, B.L., District Justice.

James Wallace, Seafield House, Black-
rock, Co. Louth was charged with the
manslaughter of Nuala McGann (3), who
died as a result of injuries received when
she was knocked down by the defendant's
lorry at Ballinacurra on Nov 8th last.

After the evidence had been given the
Justice said he was convinced that Wallace
had done everything possible to avoid the
accident, and his speed on the occasion—20
miles per hour—was not excessive. Under
these circumstances he came to the conclu-
sion that there was not a prima facie case to
go before a jury, and consequently he would
refuse informations.

HOME HELP IN THE COUNTY.

The Superintendent of Home Assistance,
at the meeting of the County Board of
Health on Wed reported that from April
to last December £15,000 had been paid out
in home assistance. That was equivalent to
a weekly outlay of £450, and from it it
was obvious that, with three months to run
to the end of the financial year, the £17,000
allocated for home help would not be
sufficient.

The Chairman (Mr M. Ryan) said it
looked as if the amount should be £20,000
for the year, and the Board would have to
look for an overdraft to meet the demands.
