## LIMERICK CIRCUIT COURT.

Judge McElligott, K.C., will open the

## OBSEQUIES OF A NUN.

In St. John's Cathedral this morning the  
obsequies took place for the late Sister Mary  
Rexebe Dormody, who died in St. John's  
Hospital on Saturday night at an advanced
