### REPARATION HOPES.

The "Times" comments:—The excellent reception in Paris, Berlin, and Rome of the agreement reached last week about reparations provides the best possible augury that the Conference when it does meet at Lausanne will produce not merely tangible but decisive results. It is, as the Foreign Secretary remarked in Paris, "a very good beginning, and to him, as to Lord Tyrrell, is due much of the credit for the result achieved. It would, of course, be misleading to attribute to reparations and war debts all the misfortunes which at present weigh so heavily on the world. But that they are a contributory cause and that their "lasting settlement" would bring most appreciable alleviation is not seriously challenged in any quarter. The tangle of economic problems cannot be straightened out in one brief sitting at Lausanne, but if only the most careful and systematic preparation be made for it the June Conference should save the credit system of Germany and prevent those profound dislocations which its ruin would certainly entail.

### DEATH OF MR J. F. MILLER.

Many old friends in Limerick will regret to learn of the death which has taken place at his daughter's residence, Fishguard, South Wales, of Mr J. F. Miller, a former District Superintendent of the G.S.W.R., at Limerick and Tralee. He had retired from active service several years ago. 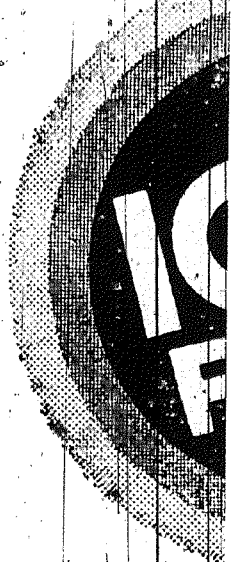
