CASTLE BARRACKS AND HOUSING.

The Town Clerk (Mr W. M. Nolan) has received a letter from the Office of Public Works stating that the proposals of the Corporation to take a lease of the Castle Barracks for housing were still under consideration. The sum which the Corporation had named for the acquisition of the site—namely, £256—was regarded by the Minister for Finance as low, in view of the situation, nature, and magnitude of the premises. They were, however, expecting an early decision on the question of terms, which would be communicated immediately on receipt.
