Wednesday, April 13th.—Cattle—Material increase, mostly young stores. The beef on sale made full rates and sold readily; not too many two-year-old feeders on sale, which are wanted; lots offered cashed where vendors took market value; a number of oldish stripper cows shown, hard to sell, unless at low prices. Short supply of useful stores in forward condition, these are in demand and found plenty of customers. Calves with shapes, colour and a bit of condition bid for; the coloury heifers in preferential demand. Stores coming out in backward condition don't find favour, and are difficult to place; luke warm competition unless for better lot, buyers cautious. The right spring seasons demand is not yet in operation, owing to the late grass season, which means less buyers in the market. Values on basis of current rates fairly well maintained. Fat heifers, £20; cows, £11 to £17 10; 2 year-old heifers, £10 to £13 10s; bullocks, £10 5s to £13; yearling heifers, £9 10s to £10 17s; second run, £5 17s 6d to £8 2s 6d; bullocks, £5 17s 6d to £9 10s. Sheep—335 penned. Best sheep made more money, steady trade, full recent rates. Good clearance.
