**DEATH OF VERY REV. CANON LEE,
 P.P., V.F., BRUFF.**

We regret to announce the death of the
 Very Rev. John Canon Lee, P.P., V.F.,
 Bruff, which took place last evening at the
 Presbytery, Bruff, in his 75th year. He
 was a native of Glenroe, and had been ill
 for some time past. He was educated at
 the Irish College, Rome, and was succes-
 sively curate at Pallaskenry, and St. Mary's
 and St. Michael's, Limerick. He was sub-
 sequently for some years Administrator of
 St. Michael's, and his first parochial charge
 was Askeaton, after which he was trans-
 ferred to Kilfinane, and on the death of
 Dean McNamara, P.P., V.G., was appointed
 to Bruff. He was Secretary of the Diocesan
 Chapter, and last month celebrated the golden
 jubilee of his priesthood. Canon Lee was
 a zealous and highly esteemed clergyman,
 and his death will be heard of with deep
 regret throughout the Diocese, where his
 ministerial life was spent.

COUNTY RATE COLLECTION.
