The second reading of the Oath Bill, introduced by President de Valera, was, after a three days' debate, carried in the Dail shortly after midnight.

The division resulted—

FOR THE BILL	...	77
AGAINST THE BILL	...	71

The first division taken was on the two amendments by Mr Cosgrave and Mr MacDermott. They were rejected by 77 votes to 71, and the vote on the Bill resulted in similar figures.

"No Negotiation Needed."

Replying to the debate, President de Valera said—"When we negotiate with Britain we will negotiate about a united Ireland—and not before. No negotiation is needed about this Oath Bill."

DEATH OF REV. D. O'CARROLL,
P.P., MUNGRET.

We regret to announce the death of the Rev. David O'Carroll, P.P., Mungret, which took place in a Dublin nursing home yesterday at the age of 65. He was a native of Granagh in this county, and was ordained at Maynooth about 40 years ago, having received his early education at Mungret College. Prior to his appointment to the pastoral charge of Mungret he was Parish Priest of Banogue. Father O'Carroll was a very popular clergyman, and his demise is mourned not alone in Mungret but throughout the diocese.

The remains are to reach Limerick this evening. Office and Requiem Mass at Raheen Church on Monday next at 11 o'clock (old time).
