# HOUSING IN THE FREE STATE.

## Government's Scheme.

The Free State Government's plans to deal with the housing problem were disclosed in a statement made in the Dail on Wed. by Mr Sean T. O'Kelly, Minister for Local Government. The proposals include:—

Increased subsidies to local authorities.
State grants to private persons.

Special grants to public utility societies.

Loans to local authorities and private persons.

The payment of these grants and subsidies will be conditional on the use, as far as possible, of certain Irish materials.
