HOUSING IN THE FREE STATE.

Government's Scheme.

The Free State Government's plans to deal with the housing problem were disclosed in a statement made in the Dail on Wed. by Mr Sean T. O'Kelly, Minister for Local Government. The proposals include:—

- Increased subsidies to local authorities.
- State grants to private persons.
- Special grants to public utility societies.
- Loans to local authorities and private persons.

The payment of these grants and subsidies will be conditional on the use, as far as possible, of certain Irish materials.
