DEATH OF REV. FATHER BANNON, C.S.S.R.

The death of the Rev. William Bannon, C.S.S.R., in Australia, at an advanced age, has been learned in Limerick with regret. The deceased clergyman was, previous to his translation to the Antipodes, attached to the Redemptorist House of Mount St. Alphonsus in the early nineties, and was for a term spiritual Director of the Arch-Confraternity of the Holy Family. He was a zealous priest and missionary, and at the meetings of the Confraternity this week Father Murray, Spiritual Director, made a touching reference to Father Bannon, and his work in building up that religious organisation.
