£100 Compensation.

An award of £100 was given at the Lime-
rick Circuit Court yesterday when Michael
Hastings, Kilkee, applied for compensation
against Mr P. J. Scanlan, O'Connell Avenue,
Limerick, in whose employment plaintiff's
daughter, Christina Hastings, was when she
died as a result of burn.

Mr Cox (instructed by Mr J. S. McNeice)
