**INFANT'S BODY FOUND IN RAILWAY
 CARRIAGE.**

The body of a female infant, carefully
 wrapped, was discovered underneath the
 seat of a third class compartment of the
 train which arrived in the city from Tralee
 at 9 o'clock yesterday morning. The
 discovery was made by a porter, and word
 was sent to the Civic Guard station, Edward
 street. When Sergeant Ford arrived he
 had the body removed to Barrington's
 Hospital morgue pending an inquest.

An inquest was held to-day at Barring-
 ton's Hospital by Mr J. S. McNeice, solr.,
 Deputy Coroner, into the circumstances con-
 nected with death.

Dr T. A. Morris, House Surgeon at
 Barrington's Hospital, stated that the body
 was that of a normal child, which was, in
 his opinion, born alive. Death was, in his
 opinion, due to neglect at birth.

Evidence having been given of the finding
 of the body, the Deputy Coroner recorded a
 verdict in accordance with the medical
 testimony.
