DEATH OF THE REV. CANON T. B. ROBERTSON.

We regret to announce the death of the Rev. Canon Thomas Boswell Robertson, which took place at the residence of his daughter, Mrs Dorrity, 34 Upper Leeson street, Dublin, this morning. The deceased clergyman, who had reached an advanced age, had been ill for some weeks, and the end, which came peacefully, was not unexpected Canon Robertson ministered in Limerick city for the long period of thirty years-three years as Rector of St. Munchin's, prior to which he was Rector of Newmarket-on-Fergus. He was instituted to St. Munchin's on the 25th May, 1895, and was appointed Prebendary of Tullymackey on the 18th August, 1911. Canon Robertson, who took an active and keen interest in Church affairs, resigned from the sacred ministry on the 30th September, 1928, and since then he took up the duties of chaplain in Budapest, Lucerne, and Vienna. was deeply intere ted in the Temperance movement and in every cause for the wellbeing of his parishioners. His death will be learned with sincere regret in this city. and sympathy extended to his family in their bereavement.

The remains will arrive in Limerick by motor hearse at 1.30 p.m. on Monday, and the interment will be in St. Munchin's at 2 p.m.
