BOY FATALLY BURNED.

John Morrissey, aged five years, living at
George's Quay, who was accidentally burned
on Monday morning by his clothing coming
into contact with the kitchen fire, died in
Barrington's Hospital yesterday evening.
The boy, who was the son of a labourer,
sustained extensive burns of the body and
hands, and little hope was entertained for
his recovery from the outset.

The Inquest.

Mr J. S. McNeice, City Coroner, held an
inquest last evening at Barrington's Hospital
into the circumstances connected with the
death.

Supt. Stack conducted the inquiry.

Ellen Morrissey, 14 Barrington's Mall,
stated that the child was her grandson, aged
five years. He and his cousin, aged 5½
years, lived with her. On Monday morning
last she got up, lit the fire, and put on a
kettle. She then left the house to get some
milk, leaving the two children in bed. She
was away about ten minutes, and when she
returned she heard shouting near the house.
Somebody told her that her grandson had
been burned, and that he was taken to
Barrington's Hospital. The fireplace was
an open one, and there was no guard around
it. This was the first time she had ever left
them alone, and they were in her charge for
two years.

Dr T. J. Morris, House Surgeon, Barring-
ton's Hospital, stated that when he ex-
amined the child after he was admitted to
the hospital he found him suffering from
a burn on the left side of the abdomen.
There were also extensive burns along the
back and shoulders, and also on the arms.
The child died about twelve o'clock on the
7th inst., and death, in his opinion, was due
to shock caused by burns.

Joseph Harris, 14 Barrington's Mall,
stated that when passing the room of Mrs
Morrissey on Monday last he heard crying.
On opening the door he saw the deceased
lying on the floor. He was dressed only in
a night shirt, which was smouldering. He
had the child, who appeared to be badly
burned, conveyed to hospital.

The Coroner recorded a verdict that the
boy died from shock caused by burns
accidentally received.
