Guard Teehan gave evidence of having arrested Foran and Mahony on the 10th instant, and three days later he took the other two into custody in Cork, where the cycles were sold for 30s. The four accused after arrest made statements admitting the charges.

Supt. Stack said there were several convictions against Doyle, while Foran had also been before the court.

District Justice Flood said it was hard to make a distinction between the accused. He sentenced Doyle and Mahony to two months each case, and McMahon and Foran to six months each.

ALLEGED ASSAULT ON LABOUR ORGANISER

A man named Griffin was arrested to-day charged with assaulting Patrick O'Brien, organiser, Transport Workers' Union. It appears that while the latter was passing through Henry Street, Mr O'Brien was costed by Griffin, who, it is alleged, struck him. At the city Court yesterday an official of a rival Labour Union was fined for assaulting Mr O'Brien, arising out of a labour dispute in the city.
