dispute with Great Britain is brought to an end during the present negotiations the economic position here will be immensely relieved, and may be the means of promoting increased trade relations between the two countries. Everyone will hope that this will be the case, as a prolongation of the crisis can only accentuate the situation, and inflict untold hardship and suffering on the side that has most to lose by an uneconomic and ruinous policy.

# COMPREHENSIVE. HOUSING SCHEME.

The Local Government Department has written to the Town Clerk approving of the lay-out plan for the erection of houses on the Island Field. The Corporation, under this scheme, propose building three hundred houses on this site at a rental that will be within the province of the workers to pay. Should the scheme materialise it will be the largest ever undertaken by the Corporation.

## DEATH OF REV. W. H. BROWN.

We regret to announce the death, which took place yesterday in Dublin, of the Rev. William H. Brown, B.A., T.C.D., Rector of Tulla, Co. Cline. Graduating from Dublin University in 1899 he was ordained three years later for the Diocese of Limerick. He passed from the curacy of St. Michael's, Limerick, in 1904 to that of Quin, of which he became Incumbent in 1909. He was Rector of Tulla from 1926 until his death.

The funeral, which was private, took place this morning to Dein's Grange Cemetery.
