A sad accident with fatal result occurred
at Ballinacurra this afternoon, the victim
being Nulah McGann, aged three years,
daughter of Mr B. J. McGann, Greenpark
Villas, Ballinacurra.

It appears that the child, seeing her father
alighting from a city omnibus, suddenly ran
across the road to meet him when she was
struck by a lorry coming from Rathkeale
and killed practically instantaneously. The
body was removed to Barrington's Hospital
morgue pending an inquest.
